Important Dates

Late August 2011

The OUAC circulates eINFO bulletins and launches the eINFO site: www.electronicinfo.ca.

August 29, 2011

The OUAC commences distribution of OUAC 101 application materials to secondary schools and school boards.

November 11, 2011

Target date for the OUAC to receive all electronic student data files from Ontario secondary schools for both hardcopy and online applications.

January 11, 2012

Deadline for Ontario secondary school students to submit completed hardcopy and online applications to the OUAC.

Note: Applications received after this date will still be processed by the OUAC and distributed to the universities. However, specific university deadlines will apply.

The original application procedure will include the collection of all final grades from previously completed Grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all current-year courses in progress.

11 janvier 2012

Date limite de réception des demandes formulées en ligne et sur papier au Centre par les élèves du secondaire.

Nota : Les demandes d'admission reçues après cette date continueront d'être traitées par le Centre et acheminées aux universités. Toutefois, ce sont les dates limites des établissements visés qui s'appliqueront.

January 26, 2012

Target date for Ontario universities to receive (from the OUAC) all application data and grades from all applications submitted by January 11, 2012.

February 7, 2012

Recommended last date for students to submit all information to the OUAC, including university and program changes, as well as additional active choices, to be eligible for consideration for early admission.

Please note: *This is not a deadline date. Changes will be accepted and processed by the OUAC at any time.*

February 15, 2012

Deadline for the OUAC to receive, from Ontario secondary schools, all final first-semester grades and current full-year midterm grades for 4U/M courses.

March 8, 2012

Target date for Ontario universities to receive (from the OUAC) all final first-semester grades and current full-year midterm grades for 4U/M courses.

April 26, 2012

Deadline date for Ontario secondary schools to report, to the OUAC, midterm grades for second-semester courses and interim grades for full-year courses. Grades that the OUAC receives earlier will be transmitted to Ontario universities when received.

May 8, 2012

Target date for Ontario universities to receive, from the OUAC, second-semester midterm grades and interim grades for full-year courses. Grades that the OUAC receives earlier will be transmitted to Ontario universities when received.

May 29, 2012

The latest date by which all secondary school applicants shall expect a response from an Ontario university. Such a response will be one of: 1) an offer of admission; 2) a refusal; or 3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information.

June 1, 2012

The earliest date by which Ontario universities may require a response to an offer of admission and a financial commitment of any kind (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.) from an Ontario secondary school student. All other admissions-related elements including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence are considered part of the offer of admission. Therefore, a student may accept these other offers prior to June 1, 2012, but Ontario universities shall not compel a student in any way to make an earlier decision.

July 19, 2012

Target date for the OUAC to transmit all remaining final grades to the universities. By this date, the OUAC will have attempted to contact all schools that have not provided their grades.

August 1–24, 2012

The OUAC collects summer school grades from Ontario secondary schools and boards.

Reminder

- Although the published deadline for applications is January 11, 2012, applicants are urged to submit their applications as early as possible.
- Guidance counsellors are responsible for providing applicants' academic data to the OUAC. Applicants must check this information carefully to ensure that there are no errors or omissions.
- Applicants may apply to as many Ontario universities/programs as they wish; however, they are limited to a maximum of three program choices at any one university (including affiliates). Some universities may further limit the number of programs to which candidates may apply.
- Applicants can make changes to their application information online at www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/. They do not complete a new application or pay another application fee. All fees are non-refundable.
- Applicants need to make note of their access codes (OUAC Reference Number and PIN). They will need them to log in to their online application.

The Application Service

The Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) is a not-for-profit, centralized application service for applicants to Ontario universities. The OUAC is operated by the Council of Ontario Universities (COU) to facilitate the process of applying to first-year undergraduate programs (bachelor's degrees) and to advanced standing in these programs. Each school is completely autonomous in reaching its own admission decisions, with the OUAC providing only the application processing service.

This application may be used for any entry point in 2012 and is valid only for the programs that appear in the list of university programs and codes. Applicants changing their entry point (e.g., winter to fall) need only amend their original application.

Le Service de demande

Le Centre de demande d'admission aux universités de l'Ontario (OUAC) est un organisme à but non lucratif qui a comme fonction principale le traitement des demandes d'admission aux universités de l'Ontario. Son administration relève du Conseil des universités de l'Ontario (CUO) et sa raison d'être est de faciliter le processus d'admission aux programmes de premier cycle (baccalauréats) ainsi que de déterminer les équivalences des cours suivis antérieurement par les candidats à ces programmes. Chaque université est autonome quant aux décisions d'admission, le Centre ne fournissant que les services de traitement des demandes d'admission.

- They are taking courses during the day at an Ontario secondary school (this includes students returning for second semester and graduated students returning to upgrade one or more courses) and have not, at some point, been out of secondary school for more than seven consecutive months.
- They will have received or expect to receive their OSSD with six 4U/M courses at the end of the current year.
- They are not currently registered at a postsecondary (college/university) institution.
- They have not completed one academic year or more of postsecondary education.
- They are applying to a diploma program or a first-year degree program at an Ontario university.

If applicants do not satisfy all of the above criteria, they should contact their guidance counsellor or the OUAC. Depending on their academic background, some applicants may need to use a different application.

Handling of Applicant Information

The Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) was created by the universities of Ontario through the Council of Ontario Universities (COU). The OUAC has been processing applications on behalf of universities in Ontario since 1971. To apply for admission to a university undergraduate program and/or a non-degree-granting program in Ontario, your application must be processed through the OUAC. The OUAC forwards your application information to the university(ies) of your choice. By applying through the OUAC, you agree that the university(ies) of your choice will obtain the personal information you have provided to the OUAC and that the OUAC will collect, use, disclose and otherwise manage your personal information as set out in the Declaration and Notice of Collection, Use, Disclosure and Treatment of Personal Information Provided as Part of Your Application to Ontario University(ies) Undergraduate Program(s) (101).

Security and Confidentiality

When receiving data from the secondary schools and applicants, and when transmitting this data to the selected Ontario universities, the OUAC takes extensive measures to ensure the security of its website and, therefore, your personal and academic information.

- The OUAC encrypts application data using Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) technology, the industry's standard for protecting web communications.
- Data files distributed over the internet by the OUAC to the universities are translated into a non-readable format that can be decoded only by the universities to which applicants have applied.

However, it is also the responsibility of applicants and their secondary school officials to protect the confidentiality of this information. Applicants should keep their personal PIN access (login) information

Traitement des données

Le Centre de demande d'admission aux universités de l'Ontario (« le Centre ») a été créé par les universités de l'Ontario, par l'entremise du Conseil des universités de l'Ontario (CUO). Le Centre traite depuis 1971 les demandes d'admission aux programmes de premier cycle et à ceux ne menant pas à un grade, pour le compte des universités en Ontario. Pour faire demande à une université de l'Ontario, votre demande d'admission doit être traitée par le Centre, lequel achemine les renseignements relatifs à cette dernière aux universités de votre choix. Applicant Reports

OUAC Acknowledgements

Depending on the time of year and the volume of applications submitted to the OUAC, it may take up to three working days to process online applications. An acknowledgement email is sent immediately after the application has been submitted.

Applicants may log in to their online application to review and to change previously submitted application information and to respond to any university offers of admission. Please note: If any changes are made to the original online application, no further acknowledgement emails will be sent. Applicants must log in to their account to verify the changes.

University Acknowledgements

Most universities will acknowledge receipt of application information and will provide applicants with a list of the specific supporting documents they require in order to make an admission decision. Applicants should contact the universities' admissions offices directly if, after a reasonable amount of time, they have not received communication from the universities they have selected. Applicants should include their OUAC Reference Number in all communication with the universities and on all supporting documents sent to the universities.

Le traitement des demandes soumises en ligne peut prendre jusqu'à trois jours ouvrables, tout dépendant du temps de l'année et du nombre de demandes soumises. Une fois la demande en ligne soumise avec succès, le Centre expédie immédiatement un accusé de réception par courriel à la candidate ou au candidat en question.

Les candidates et les candidats peuvent se connecter à leur demande en ligne pour réviser et modifier les données de leur demande préalablement soumise et pour répondre aux offres d'admission émises par les universités. Nota : aucun autre accusé de réception ne sera expédié par courriel, dans le cas de modifications apportées à la demande en ligne originale. Accusé de réception des universités

Les universités communiqueront directement avec les candidates et les candidats afin d'accuser réception de leur dossier et de leur fournir la liste des documents dont elles auront besoin pour prendre une décision d'admission. Il faut communiquer directement avec le service d'admission de l'université concernée si, après un délai raisonnable, la candidate ou le candidat n'a toujours pas reçu de renseignements de la part de cette dernière. Offers of Admission: Online Responses

The OUAC does not make any admission decisions, evaluate applications or receive detailed information from the university with regard to offers made to applicants.

Application files are evaluated individually at each university and admission decisions are made by the universities. Offers are made at different times throughout the processing cycle, depending on the university and program. The universities will communicate offers of admission, including terms of any conditional offers and appropriate response instructions, directly to applicants.

Applicants are able to accept (or for some universities, decline) offers of admission from the Ontario universities by logging in to their online application at www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/. They will require their OUAC Reference Number and PIN/password.

When the universities have evaluated an applicant's file, an admission decision will be mailed directly to the applicant. When applicants are offered admission, they will be provided with the appropriate instructions for responding. Applicants who choose to respond to their offer of admission online **should not mail a paper response to the OUAC.**

Applicants are responsible for meeting the deadline dates stipulated by the universities. Most universities require that responses to offers of admission be made online. When responding online, applicants must click the "**Submit**" button and follow the steps in order to send their response to the OUAC. A screen displaying the applicant's confirmation number will appear immediately after successfully submitting a response. This screen will include a summary of all changes/responses made within that session. Applicants should make note of the confirmation number (in writing or by printing the screen) and keep it in a safe place. Successfully submitted responses to offers of admission will be processed within one business day. Applicants should log back in to their account to verify their response(s) after one business day.

Important: An online response instruction video is available at www.ouac.on.ca/ugrad-tutorials/. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission.

Répondre aux offres d'admission en ligne

Le Centre ne prend aucune décision d'admission, n'évalue pas les qualifications des candidates et des candidats et ne reçoit aucune information détaillée des universités quant aux offres qu'elles font aux candidates et aux candidats.

Les universités évaluent les dossiers d'admission et prennent une décision quant à l'admissibilité de chaque candidate ou candidat. Les offres sont envoyées de façon continue tout au long du cycle d'admission, selon l'université et le programme. Les universités font parvenir directement aux candidates et candidats leurs offres d'admission ainsi que les directives appropriées pour y répondre, y compris les conditions relatives à toute offre conditionnelle.

La demande en ligne, qui est disponible à partir du site Web <http://centre.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/>, permet aux candidates et aux candidats d'accepter (ou de refuser, dans le cas de certaines universités) une offre d'admission des universités de l'Ontario. Au terme de leur évaluation d'un dossier, les universités envoient par la poste un document au candidat ou à la candidate, l'informant de leur décision. S'il s'agit d'une offre d'admission, la marche à suivre afin d'y répondre y sera incluse. Les candidates et les candidats qui choisissent de répondre à l'offre en ligne, **ne doivent pas envoyer le formulaire réponse en papier au Centre.**

Il incombe au candidat ou à la candidate de respecter les dates limites stipulées par les établissements. La plupart des universités exigent que les candidats répondent en ligne aux offres d'admission. Pour ce faire, cliquer sur le bouton « **Soumettre** » et suivre les directives à la lettre afin de s'assurer que la réponse soit soumise correctement au Centre. Un écran affichant le numéro de dossier du candidat ou de la candidate s'affichera à l'écran immédiatement après que ce dernier ou cette dernière aura soumis sa réponse. L'écran comprendra également un sommaire des modifications/réponses effectuées lors de la session en cours. Prière de prendre note de ce numéro de dossier (faire une impression-écran ou l'écrire sur un papier) et de le conserver soigneusement. Les réponses à une offre d'admission seront traitées dans un délai d'un jour ouvrable. Au terme d'une journée ouvrable, le candidat ou la candidate peut se connecter à nouveau à son compte afin d'y vérifier ses réponses.

Accepting an offer of admission from one university will not cancel applications to other universities and/or programs. However, applicants may have only one acceptance of an offer on file at a time. Before applicants can accept a subsequent offer online, they must first cancel the previously accepted offer.

Note: When applicants submit a subsequent paper acceptance, the OUAC will automatically cancel the previously accepted offer.

Applicants who wish to attend a university that has offered them admission but whose response deadline has expired, or who wish to re-accept an offer they previously cancelled or declined, should contact the university's admissions office to see whether they will still be considered and, if so, whether a new offer can be issued. Remember, many university programs reach capacity. The later that applicants wish to change universities, the more difficult it is likely to be to make changes.

Applicants who are concerned about accepting or declining an offer of admission should contact the university's admissions office in order to discuss their needs. The university will try to accommodate applicants as much as possible.

Note: Please do not send any applications for residence or deposit cheques to the OUAC. These items should be sent directly to the universities. Residence deposits do not replace an official response to an offer of admission through the OUAC.

Bien que les candidates et les candidats ne puissent accepter qu'une offre d'admission à la fois, une telle acceptation n'annule pas pour autant leur demande d'admission aux autres universités ou programmes. Toutefois, une seule acceptation à la fois est permise. Avant d'accepter une offre subséquente en ligne, la candidate ou le candidat doit annuler toute offre préalablement acceptée. **Nota :** Dans le cas d'une candidate et d'un candidat qui soumet ultérieurement une acceptation sur papier, le Centre annulera toute acceptation antérieure.

Les candidates et les candidats qui désirent fréquenter une université leur ayant offert une place mais dont la date limite stipulée pour y répondre est passée, ou qui désirent accepter de nouveau une offre qu'elles ou ils avaient annulée ou refusée antérieurement, doivent alors communiquer avec l'université pour savoir si elle accepte toujours leur candidature et si une nouvelle offre pourra être émise. Si l'acceptation ou le refus d'une offre d'admission cause des inquiétudes, la candidate ou le candidat doit alors communiquer avec le service de l'admission de l'université en cause pour discuter de ses besoins. Les universités feront de leur mieux pour lui venir en aide.

Nota : Ne pas envoyer au Centre la demande pour une place en résidence ou le chèque de garantie. Ces derniers doivent être acheminés directement à l'université. Le chèque de garantie pour une place en résidence ne remplace pas la réponse officielle à une offre d'admission, qui doit être traitée par le Centre.

Credit Card (MasterCard, VISA or American Express)

The OUAC accepts MasterCard, VISA or American Express for the payment of application fees. If the credit card is declined or invalid, the application will not be processed. Please note that prepaid credit cards are not valid for online payments.

Online or Telephone Banking

Applicants may pay using online or telephone banking through selected Canadian banks and credit unions. This payment service is offered through a bank's website or telephone banking department. Applicants should contact their bank for further information. Please note: It may take three to four business days for the OUAC to receive internet payments.

The OUAC will provide applicants with their bill payment account number upon submission of their completed application. Applicants will require this account number in order to submit their payment. Applicants who have applied to the OUAC previously should revise their existing bill payment account number to the new bill payment account number provided. The OUAC's bill payment name is "Ontario Universities' Application Centre" or an abbreviated version of this name.

Cheque or Money Order

Cheques or money orders should be in Canadian funds and made payable to the "Ontario Universities' Application Centre". Include the OUAC Reference Number on the face of the cheque or money order. Payment must be submitted with the application Remittance Payment Form, which is generated when an applicant selects a cheque or money order payment option.

Postdated cheques and foreign cheques (outside of Canada) are not accepted. **There is a charge of \$25 for non-negotiable cheques.**

Note for international applicants: Only an international money order or bank draft in Canadian funds that includes the bank address, and has the bank number, transit number and account number encoded on the bottom will be accepted.

If any of the above criteria are not met (e.g., a cheque is non-negotiable, total fees are insufficient), the processing of the application will be stopped at both the OUAC and the universities selected.

Applicants should:

- Complete all of the required fields pertaining to their credit card: number, date of expiry and name of the credit card holder. Ensure that these fields have been filled out correctly before authorizing the payment.
- Register the Ontario Universities' Application Centre as one of their creditors when using online or telephone banking, and arrange to pay the fees.
- Ensure that payment by cheque or money order arrives at the OUAC no later than two weeks after the application has been submitted. Applicants must remember to include the application Remittance Payment Form.

Télépaiements et paiements effectués sur Internet

Les candidates et les candidats peuvent également acquitter leurs droits par télépaiement ou directement par internet, si elles ou ils font affaire avec certaines banques ou coopératives de crédit canadiennes. Ce système de paiement s'offre à partir du site Web des banques ou de leur service bancaire par téléphone. Communiquer avec sa banque pour plus de renseignements.

Le Centre attribuera aux candidates et aux candidats un numéro de compte pour le règlement de factures dès la soumission de leur demande remplie. Elles ou ils devront citer ce numéro de compte pour effectuer le paiement. General Procedures

The online application is intended for students currently attending Ontario secondary schools.

Applicants consulting this booklet are attending a school that has registered for the online application process, thereby providing applicants with the opportunity to apply to university online. The OUAC and the secondary school guidance office will work together to ensure that application information is provided to the universities in a timely and accurate manner.

Secondary schools may have already provided the OUAC with electronic files that contain applicants' personal and academic information. Applicants simply need to review this information, make changes or additions to personal data where necessary, add their university program choices, and answer a few additional questions.

Secondary school guidance counsellors are responsible for making any required changes to academic data and will provide the OUAC with current course grades several times during the school year. If students' applications do not contain any academic data, they should contact their guidance counsellor to have their academic record added once they have successfully submitted their online application.

Généralités

La demande d'admission en ligne est destinée aux élèves actuels du niveau secondaire de l'Ontario.

Les candidates et les candidats qui consultent le présent livret fréquentent une école qui a opté d'utiliser le processus en ligne pour la soumission des demandes d'admission. Le Centre travaillera en collaboration étroite avec les conseillères et conseillers en orientation de l'école pour s'assurer que le dossier de demande de ces derniers parviendra aux universités où ils auront choisi de faire demande dans les délais prescrits.

Il se peut que l'école secondaire en question ait déjà fourni au Centre un fichier électronique contenant le dossier scolaire de ses candidates et candidats, ainsi que leurs renseignements personnels. Dans ce cas, ces derniers n'ont qu'à passer en revue cette information, apporter toute modification ou changement nécessaire à leurs renseignements personnels, ajouter leurs choix de programmes universitaires et répondre à quelques questions additionnelles.

Il revient aux conseillères et conseillers des écoles secondaires d'apporter les modifications aux données scolaires et de fournir les notes au Centre à certaines échéances tout au long de l'année scolaire. Si la demande ne contient aucune donnée scolaire, il faut alors communiquer avec son conseiller ou sa conseillère en orientation afin d'y faire ajouter son dossier scolaire, une fois sa demande en ligne soumise avec succès.

Applicants will be able to make changes to their personal information and university choices on their OUAC application online once they have submitted and paid for their application. More information about this service is provided in the section titled “After Submitting an Application”.

Certain information is supplied automatically on behalf of applicants by their school or school board. However, other information, such as supporting documentation, must be provided by the applicant when required by the universities. Applicants should therefore read all instructions carefully and ensure that this documentation is received by the applicable deadline.

Application Instructions

1. Applicants need to identify the universities and programs to which they wish to apply. Research is important. There are many publications and resources available. Before applying, applicants should:
 - Visit eINFO, the comprehensive guide to Ontario universities for secondary school students, at www.electronicinfo.ca.
 - Read the admission handbooks, guidebooks, viewbooks and calendars available directly from each university.
 - Attend the University Information Program (UIP) sessions this fall (see the schedule at www.ouf.ca/uip/).
 - Visit the universities. At the very least, applicants should review the universities' websites. URLs are provided in this booklet.
 - Most importantly, applicants should discuss their interests and goals with their parents, teachers and guidance counsellors.
2. For the most up-to-date information, applicants should visit www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/ or use the individual university information pages in this booklet to look up the program codes for the university programs to which they will apply. Applicants should write these codes down and keep the list handy when they log in to their application.

Une fois la demande d'admission soumise et les droits afférents réglés, les candidates et les candidats seront en mesure d'apporter des changements en ligne à leurs renseignements personnels et à leurs choix d'université dans leur dossier. Certains renseignements sont fournis automatiquement au nom des candidates et des candidats par les écoles secondaires ou le conseil scolaire. 2. Pour les renseignements les plus récents, les candidates et les candidats peuvent consulter le site

3. Applicants should obtain their confidential Application Access Code Letter from their guidance counsellors. Schools will notify students in late October or early November when these letters are available. The letter will provide applicants with their School Number, Student Number and Personal Identification Number (PIN), all three of which are required in order to log in to their online application.

4. Applicants should have their VISA, MasterCard or American Express information handy if they plan to pay the application fees online: card number, expiry date and the credit card verification value (CVV) will be required.

Alternatively, applicants may pay using online or telephone banking, or by cheque or money order. Applicants should see the Summary of Fees section on page 12 for details.

5. Applicants must complete the online application at www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/ and pay the applicable fees by the stipulated deadline dates.

After Submitting an Application

Immediately after applicants submit their online application, a screen displaying their OUAC Reference Number will appear. This number is a unique identifier and will be required whenever applicants communicate with the OUAC or the universities. Applicants should make note of this number (in writing or by printing the screen) and keep it in a safe place.

Using their OUAC Reference Number and PIN, applicants can access their submitted application information and make any necessary changes online. These include changes to personal information (e.g., name and address corrections) and university/program selections. Applicants will also respond to offers of admission from Ontario universities online.

After applicants have submitted and paid for all of their application fees, they will be given the option of changing their PIN to a personal password when they log in to their account.

Prochaines étapes

Une fois la demande en ligne soumise, s'affiche alors un écran accusant réception de la demande et donnant le Numéro de référence OUAC. Ce dernier constitue l'identificateur de la candidate ou du candidat et devra être cité dans toute communication avec le Centre et les universités. Questions and Answers

1. I have lost my PIN access code and login information. What should I do?

You should contact your guidance counsellor, who will be able to supply you with your School Number (MIDENT), Student Number (SSSN) and PIN so that you can log in to the online application and access your file.

2. I'm having trouble logging in to my application. Where can I go for help?

First, check the URL you have entered. It should be: www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/.

Once this has been verified, make sure that you have accurately entered your School Number (MIDENT), Student Number (SSSN) and PIN (case sensitive). Verify all three entries carefully. You may wish to double-check your login information with your guidance counsellor. If all are correct but you still cannot access your file, call Applicant Services at 519-823-1063.

3. I have noticed a mistake in my academic information (courses and grades). How can this be corrected?

Applicants cannot make changes to their academic information. Only guidance counsellors can do this. You should continue to complete and submit your application, then let your counsellor know about the problem and ask that it be corrected.

4. How can I make sure that the OUAC has received my application after I have submitted it?

As soon as you submit your online application, a screen will appear that displays your OUAC Reference Number.

You will also receive an acknowledgement email, immediately after submitting your application, which confirms receipt of your application at the OUAC (assuming that you have provided a valid email address on your application).

In addition, you will be able to use your OUAC Reference Number and your PIN to log in to your online application one business day after you have submitted and paid for your application (see Question 5). After logging in to your account, you will have the option of changing your PIN to a personal password.

Questions et réponses

1. J'ai perdu mon NIP et mon code d'accès. Que dois-je faire?

Veillez communiquer avec votre conseillère ou conseiller en orientation, qui sera en mesure de vous fournir le numéro ministériel de votre école (MIDENT), votre numéro matricule et votre NIP, lesquels vous permettront d'accéder à la demande en ligne et à votre dossier.

2. J'ai de la difficulté à atteindre ma demande. Qui peut m'aider?

5. I have submitted my online application but now I need to make changes to my university/program choices. How do I do this?

Log in to your online application through www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/. Once you are logged in, click "My Application" on the navigation bar to access your application information. Make any necessary changes to your personal information and/or university/program choice selections.

You are able to view all sections of your application and to make changes to this information (with the exception of your academic data, which can only be modified by your guidance counsellor).

You must follow a specific sequence of steps in order for your changes to be accepted. Ensure that you:

- click the "Continue" button at the bottom of each of the screens where you have made changes;
- click the "Submit" button at the top right of the screen once you have completed your changes;
- make sure that all of the changes you made have been recorded;
- click the "I verify and agree that the information above is correct as shown" button;
- select your method of fee payment, if applicable;

To change the program code or the university, you must delete the existing choice and then add the new choice.

Please note that each secondary school may have their own rules in arranging how these transcript requests are sent. Therefore, you should review these rules with your secondary school. You must also make arrangements with your postsecondary institution(s) to forward your transcripts directly to your university selections, or use the transcript request section of the 105 online application to request transcripts from Ontario universities or Ontario colleges.

9. I transferred to a different school after first semester (or halfway through the school year). Who lets the OUAC and the universities know about this change?

If you apply for admission while at one school and then transfer to a different school, please request that your new school advise the OUAC of this change. Your new school should provide the OUAC with the new school name, the School Number (MIDENT), your new Secondary School Student Number (SSSN), if applicable, and your Ontario Education Number (OEN). The OUAC will then notify your university choices. Please remember to inform the OUAC if your mailing address has also changed.
